



Selective Service Registration Instructions

How to find out if you are registered:

- 1) Log on to the website <http://www.sss.gov>
- 2) On the top half of the page, you will see two options: “Register Online” and “Check a Registration;” click on “Check a Registration”
- 3) In the appropriate fields, enter your last name, social security number and date of birth; click “Submit”
- 4) A screen should pop up at that point that shows a “Matched Record,” which you will need to print out; if that screen does not pop up or there are no matches found, that either means you are not registered or may have accidentally typed in the wrong information on the previous screen (we recommend that you try again, carefully checking the information you enter, so as to ensure it was not just a typo)
- 5) If you are sure that you typed in the correct information and still are not able to find a “Matched Record,” then you are not registered

How to register, if you are between the ages of 18 and 25 and have not already done so:

- 1) Log on to the website <http://www.sss.gov>
- 2) On the top half of the page, you will see two options: “Register Online” and “Check a Registration;” click on “Register Online”
- 3) Complete the “Selective Service System Online Registration Form” and click “Submit Registration”
- 4) Print out the confirmation screen verifying that your information was received

How to request a waiver if you are 26 years of age or older and have not registered:

- 1) Log on to the website <http://www.sss.gov>
- 2) On the far left-hand side of the screen, there is a link for “registration information;” click on it
- 3) Scroll down the screen and click on the link “Men Over the Age of Eligibility to Register”
- 4) Read carefully the information on that page
- 5) Toward the bottom of the screen, there is another link called “Request for Status Information Letter;” click on it and print that form
- 6) Complete that form ***in full*** and turn it in to your Case Manager; you will be notified of the decision by the Southern Nevada Workforce Investment Board to grant or not grant a waiver from there
